Where to take your old electricals

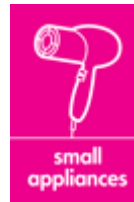

Alternatively, visit recyclenow.com and type in your postcode to find your nearest recycling point. You'll also find more information about what happens to your old electricals when you recycle them.

Hairdryers, hair straighteners, electric toothbrushes, hair trimmers, shavers, hair curlers, facial saunas, power showers and more.



Kettles, toasters, irons, blenders, sandwich toasters, coffee machines, whisks, bread makers, electric scales, smoothie makers and more.



Drills, power tools, garden shears, strimmers, jigsaws, sanders, angle grinders, chainsaws, lawnmowers, garden sprinklers and more.
