LOCAL ISSUES NEED LOCAL PEOPLE TO SPEAK UP FOR THEM and a local council is the best chance of having a local voice and to express a local view to those who have influence over your local community.

YOU could help keep Wolvey a vibrant, good place to live by becoming a parish councillor.

YOU could be in at the 'grassroots' level of Local Government and be involved in making things happen or getting things sorted.

YOU could get local views about local issues brought to the attention of the powers that be.

You only need to be able to give up one evening a month to attend parish council meetings, and in return you will receive the satisfaction of knowing that you are helping your local community.

Candidates must be at least 18 years of age and a British subject or a citizen of the Commonwealth or European Union and must satisfy at least **one of the following:**

- be a local government elector for the parish of Wolvey;**
- have, during the whole of the previous 12 months, occupied land or other property in the parish, either as owner or tenant;**
- have, during the whole of the previous 12 months, had your principal or only place of work in the parish;**
- have resided in the parish during the whole of the previous 12 months.**

The parish council normally meets on the third Monday of the month at 7.30pm. New councillors will hold office until the next local elections in 2018.
